
The Challenge

The Problem:

- Impacts of pollution are not felt equally across the state
- People of color experience 26-36% more vehicle pollution (PM_{2.5}) than white residents


Our Mission:

- Ensure equitable benefits to underserved and overburdened populations
- Address inequities in the clean transportation sector and further Massachusetts' climate and equity goals



Accelerating Clean Transportation For All

- First program round was launched in 2022
 Funded 10 projects totaling \$5 million
- Topic areas of projects included
 - o Electric bikes
 - o EV consumer education
 - Ride-for-hire electrification and incentives
 - E-cargo bike delivery
- Results of ACT4All Round 1
 - 9 Pilot Projects currently running
 - o 512 e-bikes deployed
 - 9 electric rideshare vehicles on the road



ACT4All 2 RFP Overview


► Funding:

- o \$7 million total
- o Individual grants of \$500K-\$1M

► Goals:

- Demonstrate scalable and equitable paths to decarbonization in the transportation sector;
- Maximize GHG emissions reductions, health, and economic benefits in overburdened areas and increase clean transportation access for underserved populations;
- Demonstrate efficient and effective program delivery, community partnership, and/or implementation models that both reach and meaningfully include Priority Populations; and
- Represent the diversity of Massachusetts communities, from a geographic, demographic, and socioeconomic lens.

Successful projects will be replicable, scalable, innovative, and equitable



Topic Areas







Topic Area 1: EV Charging Station Access

► Topic:

 Expand access to EV charging stations for residents without a dedicated driveway, garage, or parking spot

Priority Populations:

- Residents without access to at-home EV charging capabilities
- Residents of low- and moderate-income housing complexes and multi-unit dwellings

Renters

Residents of public housing complexes





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Topic Area 2: RTA Decarbonization

► Topic:

 Reduce vehicle emissions associated with Regional Transit Authorities ("RTAs") and/or expand access to public clean transportation for underserved and overburdened communities.

Priority Populations:

- O Urban and rural communities who would benefit from access to clean public transportation
- Older adults and/or people with disabilities
- Low- and moderate-income communities





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Topic Area 3: Expanding Access to Economic Opportunities

► Topic:

 Expand access to clean transportation careers and develop capabilities to better reduce transportation and workforce burdens for individuals in Priority Populations.

Priority Populations:

- Workers in need of upskilling and/or education in clean transportation technology to accommodate additional role responsibilities
- Rural communities
- Low- and moderate-income communities





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Topic Area 4: Other

► Topic:

- Projects that do not fit under the predefined Topic
 Areas but support the goals of the ACT4All 2 Program
- Results in equitable emissions reductions in subsectors/methods unexplored in other Topic Areas
- Priority Populations:
 - Any defined Priority Population that is not met by other Topic Areas



- How is the project innovative? What is the innovative technology, business model, program structure, etc. that the project will demonstrate?
- How can the proposed project be replicated and scaled up?
- What are the goals of the project and what will project success look like? How will success be measured?
- How is the Applicant Team <u>well-suited</u> to implement the project proposed?
