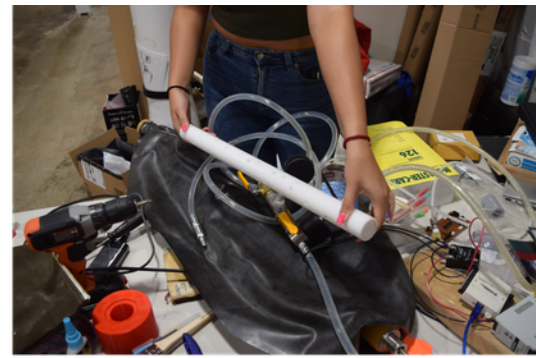
Eligibility Requirements

Must be:

- A junior or senior at a MA vocational or technical high school
- A college student who is a MA resident or a non-MA resident attending college in MA;
- A Career Technical Initiative (CTI) or an After Dark participant
- A recent graduate from any of the above
- For high school students only: must complete your school's own co-op eligibility requirements (i.e. grades, attendance, OSHA certification, etc.)
- Must not be an existing employee, or existing intern that has been on payroll for greater than six weeks at a host employer

Students

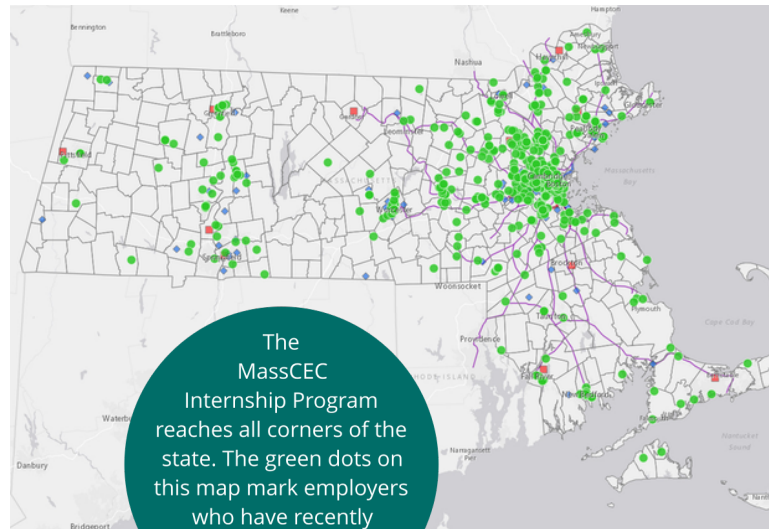
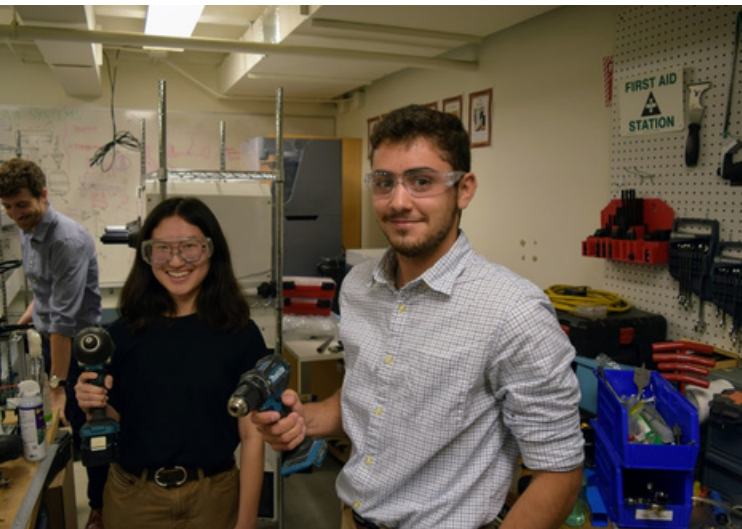
Students should follow these steps to complete the hiring process:

1. Register for an account
 - a. If you're a high school or After Dark student, ask your Co-op Coordinator or Career Support Staff to create an account for you
 - b. CTI students, and/or those who have graduated or are over 18 can create their own account
2. Communicate with clean energy employers
3. Sign an Offer Letter

Co-op Coordinators and Career Education Staff

Coordinators will work with employers to recruit students by completing the following tasks:

1. Meet with students
2. Collaborate with employers
3. Submit online application, including transcripts, for each student that receives a subsidized work placement offer
4. Finalize agreements



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
